




FIGURE 2.1. The theoretical framework









## Puzzles


- The traditional L-R scale no longer explains voting behavior:
  - 33% of the vote in 2012 against 10% in 2022
  - Ideology and socio-demographics explain 14% of the vote in 2022
- How can we explain that the poor do not vote for redistritibutive policies?
- What is the key difference in the anti-system votes for the left and the right?

# A new framework for understanding political choice: social trust and well-being




Graph shows average responses to life satisfaction and trust, grouped by who respondents voted for.

**Life satisfaction**: On a scale of 0-10, how satisfied are you with your life today?


Interpersonal trust: Generally speaking, would you say that most people can be trusted, or that you can't be too careful in dealing with people?

Holds when controlling for a wide variety of SD variables, explanatory power largest for Macron and Le Pen







Weighted average of responses for voters for each candidate in the first round in 2017.





# Distrust in institutions common to all antisystem electors


All voters of anti-system parties share a high level of distrust towards institutions.

#### Distrust in national institutions in Europe





#### Vote to Exit the EU and Total Unemployment in 2014









## Impacts on self-control (Aggression and Attention) and school performance





Return: 1 dollar at age 8 leads to a 11 dollar pay-off at age 39, with an internal rate of return of 17%





## Conclusion

- Politics of 2 new axes provide a comprehensive framework to understand anti-system forces in France, Europe and the USA:
  - Low life satisfaction and distrust in institutions are common to anti-system votes
  - Interpersonal trust : split between radical left/right votes
- Determinants:
  - Life satisfaction and distrust in institutions: highly correlated with economic insecurity
  - Interpersonal trust: Mobility and loneliness in post-industrial societies
- Policy consequences :
  - Redistribution and inequality (Piketty, 2018).
  - But part of the poor vote for anti-redistributive platforms
  - Policies to boost generalized trust and fight loneliness at work and in remote territories (post Yellow vests recommendations)
